Pre-Kindergarten 3 & 4 Curriculum Overview

Handwriting

In PreK spelling and phonics, students devote the year to writing all English letters in print, as well as how to use fine motor skills that are necessary for good penmanship.

Reading

In Pre-K reading, students are given opportunities to grow in their affection for fine stories and poems through the reading of various children's' books as a group.

History

In PreK history, students will be exposed to key figures and dates in history that are particularly associated with holidays, festivals, and Biblical stories as they are pertinent in the year. Students have a less formal curriculum, but more of an incidental discovery of the idea of history as it applies to other topics they discuss in class.

Science

In PreK science, students will spend more time observing and playing. Though they will learn about the basics of classification, the order of nature, and how to make connections between observations, students will be encouraged to see science as a fun time to pursue their curiosity and engage in the wonder of discovery.

Math

In PreK math, students begin to grow familiar with the symbols we use for numbers and how single digit numbers relate to one another. Students also begin to recognize shapes, patterns, and apply some basic number principles to everyday life.

Art

Students will create various projects that are derived from the weekly themes using an assortment of mediums such as, brush painting, finger painting, water colors, colored pencils, crayons as well as pasting and cutting.

P.E.

In the first year of physical education, students begin to learn basic movements and directions, while building balance, coordination, and strength. Through participation in organized games, students will gain greater control over their bodies as they apply them to individual and team challenges.
